Education Scotland Evaluative Language



almost all	means	over 90%

Response to survey





- The majority of pupils responded to our survey
- Few parents/carers responded, especially from 54/5/6





Do you feel you have been bullied in school in last 2 years?





 The majority of pupils and parent/carers stated that they (their young person) had not experienced bullying in the past 2 years





Type of bullying experienced





- Both pupils and parent/carers stated that verbal, name calling, gossiping was the bullying behaviour that young people had experienced the most
- They also stated that they experienced exclusion, ignoring, isolating, threats and intimidation





Where and Who?





- Most pupils and the majority of parent/carers stated bullying happened in corridors or in class
- The majority of pupils and less than half of parents stated bullying happened online
- Most pupils and parent/carers stated that bullying behaviour was by someone in the same year



Reporting bullying





- Less than half of pupils reported bullying
- Of the pupils that reported bullying, the majority were happy how it was dealt with
- The majority of parent/carers stated that their young person had reported bullying
- Less than half of parent/carers were happy how it was dealt with





Witnessed bullying in school?





- Less than half of pupils believe they have witnessed bullying in school
- Of those pupils that have witnessed bullying, most did not report it





What more can LA do?



- Pupils and parent/carers
 - Ensure pupils understand what bullying behaviour involves
 - Reassure that reports of bullying behaviour will be taken seriously



- Pupils
 - PSE lessons to include prejudice, discrimination, harassment and protected characteristics
- Parent/Carers
 - A positive ethos of reporting "speak up and report"





Action Plan – next steps



- Update Anti-bullying Policy to reflect survey results
- Speak Up and Report Share clear guidance about how to report bullying with pupils, parent/carers and staff
 and build confidence that this is being dealt with
- School Culture Ensure our school community understands what bullying behaviour involves and actively challenges this through staff training, school assemblies, parent/carer awareness etc.
- Shout Outs enhance anti-bullying culture by celebrating positive messages across school on weekly basis
- PSE Curriculum reviewed to ensure it explains, reassures and challenges bullying behaviour as part of the "Personal Safety" block in all years.
- MVP (Mentors in Violence Protection) Programme Uses peer education and bystander approach to tackle gender-based violence and bullying. The Bystander approach is key to promote the "Speak up and Report" approach.
- Curriculum Structure reviewing structure to enhance positive relationships and increased wellbeing focus in classrooms

Definition of Bullying (Anti-bullying Alliance)



Bullying is the repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an imbalance of power. It can happen face to face or online.

What does this bullying behaviour look like?



Speak Up & Report- What is our role?

- > Respond when we see bullying behaviour EVERYONE
- >Start a conversation with a friend/s if we notice them giving someone a hard time they might not realise this is hurtful.
- >Start a conversation with a friend/s if we notice they are getting a hard time from some one else. They might just need that support to talk about it.
- Start a conversation with any member of staff if you are experiencing bullying behaviour, you have witnessed it or are aware of it happening.
- > Be clear that we take bullying behaviour seriously.
- >SPEAK UP & REPORT any behaviour you find is bullying

Intentional, Hurtful, Repetitive, involves an Imbalance of Power

Bullying behaviour observed by/reported to staff



All staff -

- Notice/Listen to incident and ascertain details from all involved
- Complete Bullying Incident Form (page 1) to include appropriate action(s) which may include
 - o Restorative conversation
 - o Logical consequence (e.g. move seat)
 - o Further investigation by Pupil Support Teacher
- Pass completed form to Pupil Support Teacher (box in Wellbeing Office)







Pupil Support Teacher actions may include -

- · Restorative conversation
- · Logical consequence (eg payback)
- · Inform parent/carer
- · Refer to SMT if appropriate
- · Report to Police if appropriate
- Complete Bullying Incident Form (page 2)



Pupil Support Teacher -

- · Monitor/review incident for 2 weeks following incident
- Pass completed Bullying Incident Form to Pupil Support Manager



Pupil Support Manager

- · Record Incident Form in Seemis and file
- On-going Quality Assurance and analysis of bullying incidents
