





## Summarised Positives from tonight's experience

Parents had a positive experience during the online parent-teacher conference, with high-quality feedback, professional and enthusiastic teachers, and clear identification of next steps. The extra minute and structured feedback sessions were beneficial, and the online system saved time and provided convenience for parents. The teachers were knowledgeable about the students and provided constructive feedback and advice for exam preparation. Overall, the conference was reassuring and informative for parents, who appreciated the opportunity to connect with teachers and receive feedback on their children's progress.

## Summarised Frustrations about the evening

Parents provided feedback on a recent virtual parent-teacher meeting. Some parents experienced technical issues, such as difficulties in logging in, problems with audio or video, and dropping calls. A few parents missed the chance to see certain teachers, and some felt that the allocated time of 6 minutes per appointment was not sufficient. Some parents also expressed a preference for in-person meetings, while others suggested the need for longer appointment times, especially for subjects where their children were struggling.
