My Obsession:

Outcome - Poster or PowerPoint that depicts both crazes and gives some basic information about them.

Home Learning Task: Exploring Crazes and Fads Across Generations

Steps:

Step 1: Research and Gathering Information

Sit down with your parent or guardian and have a chat about the popular crazes and fads they remember from their childhood. Take notes during the conversation or record it (with permission) to make sure you remember all the interesting details.

Think about the things that are really popular among kids today. What are the games, toys, shows, movies, or trends that everyone seems to be talking about? Make a list of these.

Step 2: Creating Your Poster or PowerPoint for Poster:

Draw a line down the middle to create two columns.

Label one column "Crazes from [Parent's/guardian's] Generation" and the other column "Crazes from My Generation." Use your notes and research to fill in each column with a list of crazes and fads from the respective generations. You can also add colourful drawings or images to make it more interesting.

Step 3: Presentation

If you're doing a poster, display it in a place where your family can see it.

If you're doing a PowerPoint, invite your parent or grandparent to sit down with you and present your findings. Share the slides and talk about the crazes together.
