## 1. <u>Welcome</u>

The Chair, Helen White, welcomed everyone to the meeting.

### 3. <u>Annual Report of the Parent Council for 2021/22</u>

Helen White presented the report which provided the following information:

#### a) Parent Council membership

#### b) Summary of the year

The parent council has had a very busy year. It was the first year where we fully implemented our new revised constitution which allowed us to have 15 members on the parent council, which brought lots of new voices and ideas on to the council.

We were particularly saddened to learn of the passing of Karen Jarvis' husband in late 2020. This provided its own challenges with the school being led by the three depute heads for the majority of the year.

As a parent council we were heavily involved in the recruitment process to pick Karen's replacement and are delighted to welcome Grant Abbot as our new head teacher to the school this term and to have him here with us this evening.

At our regular meetings we discussed many issues throughout the year including:

- Communication
- Covid response
- Accommodation and Capacity Issues
- Employability of our children
- Health & amp; wellbeing
- Parental Reporting Evenings

• Exam provision for 2021

These meetings continued to be held on zoom due to the ongoing restrictions.

#### c) Detailed Areas

I would like to highlight just a few of the areas where we have been particularly active this year.

#### Recruitment

Following Karen's resignation during the year, a number of us were involved in the recruitment process to appoint a new head teacher. We initially ensured that a good proportion of the parent council had received the recruitment training provided by West Lothian Council. A smaller committee of nine people met on a regular basis to ensure that the parent voice was heard as part of the recruitment process and that your views were represented. Six of us took part in the full day of first round interviews. Douglas Maxwell (vice chair) and I were also involved in the second round of interviews at which Grant Abbot was appointed. We are delighted that he was able to fill the post straight away at the beginning of the new school year and look forward to working with him in the future.

#### Communication

Communication between the parent council, parent forum members and school has been an issue that the parent council have been discussing for a number of years. It was decided this year to tackle this more specifically and number of members formed a group to look at this more closely. They used the Connect 'Communication Healthcheck' to identify possible areas of improvement. Many different options for communication were discussed. This is still an ongoing topic where input is still being sought and lessons to be learned following a parental survey in the latter part of the year. This group were instrumental in setting up a LA Parent Council Facebook page which now has several hundred followers. Other areas have been considered such as notice boards, banners, twitter, apps etc. The Parent Council will continue to discuss this into the new school year.

I would like to thank all the members of this group for the time and effort that they are putting in on an ongoing basis.

#### Accommodation & Capacity

Following on from the concerted efforts that we had last year to raise the issue of the accommodation and capacity issues at the academy, we have continued to engage intermittently with the council regarding this issue. We were able to welcome James Cameron to our meeting in January to give us an update on the new high school being built in Winchburgh and how and when this would affect our own school. The minutes of our meeting on 28 January are on our webpage if you are interested in reading more of what was discussed. This will continue to be an issue of concern over the next few years.

#### Covid response & SQA exams

Many of our meetings were taken up with discussions on the school's response to Covid and the impact of the pandemic on the senior phase exams. We were able to spend time questioning the senior management on their provision and to offer feedback where we felt it was necessary. We also discussed the pastoral support and health and wellbeing provision as the pupils spent time in and out of school during the year.

#### d) Summary

I would like to note our thanks to the three teacher representatives Rhona White, Alastair Blair and Luisa Burgess who attended our meetings where they could. We also want to thank the Pupil Council representatives, Finlay Watson and Eilidh MacDonald for their valuable contributions over the course of the year. We wish them all the best as they leave school and start on their chosen path. I would also like to thank the senior management team who stepped up to take on the leadership of the school during this difficult time and for the way in which they coped with that.

I would like to welcome Grant Abbot to our school and I'm sure the newly elected parent council will look forward to working closely with him over the next year and onwards.

And finally, I would like to personally thank all the parent council members who have given of their time this year in whatever capacity and for engaging at a level that we haven't seen for a number of years. Long may that continue.

- 3. Our learner centred curriculum will offer learner pathways that build on challenge and improved attainment opportunities to meet the needs of all learners.
- 4. Our bespoke and targeted curriculum offer will build on challenge and provide enhanced flexible pathways to increase attainment opportunities for identified cohorts of learners.

#### School environment

- Maths and Languages corridors first up for new corridor visuals.
- Some additional painting around their PE department has been requested and a tidy up of quad area/shrubs.

#### **Covid Update**

- A number of positive cases over last few weeks.
- SP pupils contact teachers and use TEAMS
- BGE classes: weekly overview should now be in place.

#### Learner Voice

- Fortnightly meetings with Pupil Leadership Team
- Pupil Parliament on SIP
- Awards ceremony end of September to recognise academic achievement in SQA diet

A query was raised about the description of corridors and pupils feeling that they must keep their heads down. This hasn't been Grant Abbot's experience since he has been with the school, however the corridors are very busy and pupil parliament will continue working on the environment created in corridors.

A query was raised about the capacity of the canteen/lunch time interval areas. The HT suggested arranging a tour for the LAPC and more feedback will follow, after further observation.

A question was raised about pupil communication in term of the parents' and staff options created for weekly feedback. The HT confirmed that conversations are different in small one-to-one chats and that options are available through PSC, pupil guidance and Support Staff. This is also an Agenda point for the Pupil Council Committee, to require feedback that is sustainable, impactful and meaningful, even when it's confidential.

#### 5. Pupil Council's Update

The Parent Council heard from Andrew McGrill and Ellie Roy about their plans for the year and working alongside the Parent Council.

We heard how they are planning on expanding from twelve pupils to approximately 60 - 80 pupils, across the board, to create a pupil cabinet. The different committees to cross over all faculties will be Eco pupil, Pupil Charity and Inclusive pupil groups.

The pupil council have already started working along S6 students to increase interactions and influences on S1 students. The staff feedback is that a reassuring presence, specially at lunch

time has been created. Moving forward they are planning opportunities for after school clubs; all sort of S6 organised clubs.

A query was raised about Discord, a gaming platform for networking. The Pupil Council is aware that S6 students uses this unsupervised platform to connect.

#### 6. <u>Election of Parent Council Members for 2021/22</u>

There were 13 vacancies to fill. 10 members of the Parent Forum volunteered for the vacancies a. Since the number of vacancies exceeded the number of volunteers, there was no need for a vote.
