



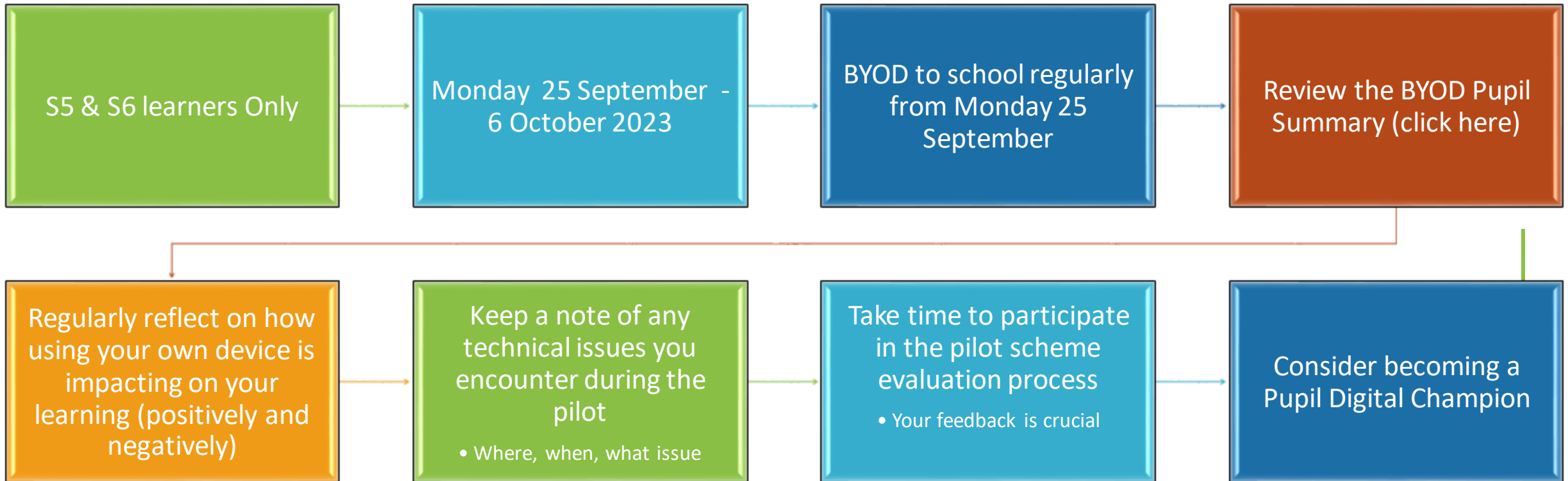

Connect your digital devices to the internet using the AAL network

Follow the school's Pupil Acceptable Use of ICT Policy (same as the policy for smartphones)

It's at each teacher's discretion as to when digital devices may be used in class

4

Devices are used for educational purposes only during the school day
