1. Welcome and apologies – AMP welcomed everyone to the meeting and noted apologies as above.
2. Minutes of the previous meeting - The minutes of the previous meeting were agreed.

Matters arising:

GA gave an update on the wearing of school uniform. After discussion at the last PC meeting, an email was sent out to all parents /carers and there was a subsequent improvement in compliance.

3. Items from parent forum

- Toilets – There were a number of issues raised about the condition and use of toilets in school. GA gave an update on current situation including issues around plumbing problem, inappropriate use of toilet facilities, monitoring of toilets facilities by senior staff. He updated PC members on plans for potential new toilet provision.
- Cover for classes – To be added to next agenda if necessary
- Use of mobile phones – Concerns were raised about the inappropriate use of mobile phones in class and suggested strategies to address this. GA outlined plans to address use of mobile phones in class. All parent/carers will be asked to give their views on proposals.

4. Focus Topic - Student interactions (Positive behaviour framework)/Equality and Diversity

GA gave an update on the positive behaviour framework, including:

- Reference to Promoting Positive Relationships And Behaviour In Educational Establishments
- West Lothian framework is being updated at moment
- Scottish Government is also discussing behaviour frameworks at a national level
- School values

followed by discussion.

5. Support for video conference provision for PC meetings

AMP outlined challenges around offering hybrid provision but also commitment to continue with provision to ensure accessibility. Various suggestions were made to support this.

AMP gave an update on the fund-raising group and requested interest in taking a lead. Laura McGowan and Kelda Bryson are happy to join the group and take a lead, bringing experiences from respective PS fundraising.
